

2008 convention report

'Finding a Fortune in Carson Valley'

For the first time since Salt Lake City in 2002, the Horatio Alger Society headed west for its annual convention, hosted by Janice and Mike Morley in Carson City, Nevada, on May 15-18, 2008.

"Finding a Fortune in Carson Valley" may not have resulted in any of the Partic'lar Friends and guests actually hitting the jackpot, but they did find plenty of

hot weather, It was quite a shock to find 90-plus degree conditions upon our arrival at Reno-Tahoe International Airport. Larry Rice, who with his wife, Vivian, flew into Sacramento, rented a car and made the drive to Carson City, describes the weather in more detail in his first President's Column on Page 2.

Heat or no heat, it was quite amazing to view the landscape of the Carson Valley, with the snow-topped Sierras providing a spectacular background.

Nevada's state capital is like a time capsule, the city's historic district like that of a movie set from the late 1890s. Nearby, Virginia City offered additional "blasts from the past," as did one of America's most welcome vacation destinations, Lake Tahoe and its sparkling blue waters.

Several members arriving early for the convention took in the scenic drive around the lake, which forms part of the border of Nevada and California.

The Plaza Hotel Carson City was ready for our arrival on May 15, and after checking in, we headed to the hospitality room to receive our convention registration materials and souvenirs, as well as renew old friendships and enjoy a cold soft drink and free snacks.

The annual Board of Directors meeting in the hotel's

Sierra Room was called to order by President Mike Morley at 4:31 p.m. The meeting featured reading of annual reports by the Treasurer, Executive Director, Newsboy editor and the nominating committee report, along with the site of the 2009 convention. Thursday evening was reserved for dinner on our own, as well as further socializing in the hospitality

room. Many members had dinner at the Carson Station restaurant and casino, located conveniently just across Carson Street from the hotel.

Friday, May 16

Following breakfast on our own, the convention officially opened in the Rosewood Conference Room at 8:45 a..m., with welcoming remarks by Mike Morley in his dual roles as H.A.S. President and convention host.

The morning's three presentations were "Beckoning at the Gate: Horatio Alger, Jr., and the Lit-

erary Canon," by former H.A.S. President Art Young (PF-941); "Worthy Challenger to the Stratemeyer Syndicate: A.L. Burt's Inexpensive Series Books," by Newsboy editor Bill Gowen (PF-706); and "It's a Real Horatio Alger Story! The History of a Newspaper Cliché," by Matthew Hirshberg (PF-1103).

Following a short break, a buffet line was set up in the lobby, and all members enjoyed a full lunch. During dessert, President Morley called the annual H.A.S. business meeting to order. Presented to the Board of Directors the day before, Chris DeHaan read the Treasurer's Report and Rob Kasper the Executive Director's Report.

The slate of officers as brought by the Nominating Committee to the directors, was presented to the

Editor's notebook

Another successful convention is history, and as Larry Rice mentions in his inaugural President's Column, we all endured the record mid-May heat wave that hit the Carson Valley as well as Northern California.

Traveling from the Chicago area with John Juvinall for his record 31st consecutive convention was a pleasure, with special thanks to his daughter, Juanita Durkin, and her family, who provided transportation from Hinsdale to and from Midway Airport. Juanita also was my "chauffeur" at Carson City for our return trip to Reno-Tahoe International Airport, as well as for several local trips. While John and Juanita took in the scenic route around Lake Tahoe upon our arrival on May 15, Chris DeHaan had also rented a car for Milt Ehlert and herself, and they gave me a lift to Carson City. This worked out very conveniently because all five of us were on the same Southwest Airlines flight from Chicago.

The many Partic'lar Friends who took in the sights in the Carson City-Lake Tahoe-Virginia City area had nothing but praise for some of the finest landscape scenery in North America. Host Janice Morley's effusive description of the area in her convention preview articles was not an exaggeration!

Alger-Ellis update: Last fall, Brad Chase wrote a Newsboy article about his recent discovery in an upstate New York bookstore of a copy of *Tom Thatcher's Fortune* using the same A.L. Burt cover design as its first edition of *In Search of Treasure*. This was Format 44 as listed in his 1983 reference book, *Horatio Alger Books Published by A.L. Burt*.

In his article, Brad noted that although he felt it was possible Burt had also produced Alger reprint titles in that format, the only hard evidence so far was the existence of an Edward S. Ellis reprint title, *Work and Win*, as described by Ellis expert Denis Rogers in Dime Novel Round-Up in 1977.

When Brad's article appeared in the September-October 2007 Newsboy, we did not have a copy of the Ellis book close at hand to show you for a side-by-side comparison with *In Search of Treasure*. Later, I was able to provide a side-by-side view of the shared A.L. Burt cover designs of Alger's *Wait and*

having the book in your hand when book shopping, as opposed to buying on the Internet.





membership: Lawrence R. Rice (PF-757) for President, Robert G. Sipes (PF-1067) for Vice President and Chris DeHaan (PF-773) for Treasurer (two-year terms); and for Directors (three-year terms) Arthur Smitter (PF-952), Robert L. Kersch (PF-946) and Jeff Looney (PF-903).

President Mike Morley warmly thanked the outgoing directors, Thomas Kline, Lee Switzer and Milt Ehlert, for their three years of service to the Society.

The floor was opened for additional nominations and there were none, so the nominated slate of officers and directors was put to a voice vote and overwhelmingly elected.

Morley also reported an anonymous donation specifically earmarked for this year's Strive and Succeed Award recipient in the amount of \$1,000, increasing this year's award to \$2,000. A discussion of the Strive and Succeed Award ensued, with no set annual amount specified. An award of at least \$1,000 is the desired minimum, drawn from the Strive and Succeed Award fund, which is built through donations by members (usually at the time they pay their annual dues).

Morley also announced he would continue to manage the official H.A.S. Web site, and that it had been voted by the directors, on a trial basis, to include the H.A.S. membership roster on the site's archive section. This will have restricted access to members only, by means of a password.

Of course, the major item of interest in the annual business meeting is the location for the following year's convention. An offer to host the 2009 convention in Charlottesville, Va., was made this spring by Jeff and Judy Looney and approved by the Board of Directors for presentation to the membership at the business meeting.

Because of Charlottesville's unique need for convention groups to reserve a potential hotel more than a year in advance (University of Virginia graduation and major tourist attractions), confirmed dates have been secured for April 30 through May 3, 2009. Executive Director Rob Kasper added that Looney would be arranging a private tour of Monticello (Thomas Jefferson's estate), including areas of the home not generally available to the public.

The membership enthusiastically voted to accept Charlottesville, Va., as the site of the 2009 convention. Incidentally, we visited Charlottesville in 1987, the convention hosted by George and Alice Owens.

Following the annual business meeting, the Rosewood Conference Room was rearranged to accommo-

date the annual donation and consignment auction.

This year's auction included the second part of the Carl T. Hartmann Legacy Collection, donated by his family to the Society; donated Alger books from the estate of longtime member Forest P. Porter (PF-834); and the second consignment of Algers by Ann Sharrard (PF-325). There was also a small selection of individual donations and consignments by those attending the convention. Because the total auction items comprised more than 350 lots, the auction was scheduled to carry over to Saturday, if necessary.

Auctioneers Larry Rice, Art Young and Bob Kersch moved the proceedings along smoothly, and well over 200 lots had been auctioned before it was decided to call it a day by late afternoon. The high bid for the day was \$950 for a consigned first edition of *Bertha's Christmas Vision*, won by Barry Schoenborn (PF-1087).

A well-earned one-hour break was followed by short drive via car pools to nearby Grandma Hattie's Restaurant for an excellent pasta dinner. The annual Alger Quiz (a tradition started in the 1960s by the late Ralph Gardner) was prepared this year by 2007 winner Rob Kasper and convention host Mike Morley. Taking top honors was Bob Sipes.

Following dinner, we returned to the hotel, with the hospitality room remaining open until late in the evening.

Horatio Alger Society Board of Directors Meeting

Michael Morley, President, called the meeting to order at 4:31 p.m. No old business was noted.

Chris DeHaan, Treasurer, presented the annual financial report. Gross income for the previous 12 months was \$16,589.51 and expenses were \$9,873.17, resulting in net income of \$6,716.34 for the fiscal year ending April 30, 2008. Total cash on hand includes \$7,436.73 in checking deposits and \$8,453.93 in a certificate of deposit for a total of \$15,890.66. Interest earned on the funds in the certificate of deposit was \$593.41. It was noted that \$117.30 was received by the Treasurer from MissionFish from eBay auctions. MissionFish is a mechanism for nonprofits to enhance fundraising by receiving a percentage of each sale on eBay as designated by the seller. All MissionFish monies are earmarked for the *Strive & Succeed Award* fund.

Robert E. Kasper, Executive Director, reported total membership at 163. This includes 131 Regular members, one Sustaining member, 11 Life, 10 Honorary and 10 Libraries. There were six members added during the previous 12 months and five drops for a net gain of one member. This compares favorably to the previous 12-month period

when we lost four members. One new member joined online and five current members renewed their memberships online (via PayPal). There were no *Strive & Succeed Award* donations made online.

The **Newsboy** Report was given by William R. Gowen, Editor. The print run for **Newsboy** is currently 200 issues and was recently reduced due to the declining membership level. The total cost for six issues of **Newsboy** was approximately \$500 less than the previous 12 months due to the lower print run. There was one color issue published during the previous year; additional color issues will continue when articles and related illustrations are appropriate. The recent postage rise will increase mailing costs for individual issues from \$1.14 to \$1.17; however, this will not dramatically affect costs due to our current membership level.

The Nominating Committee Report was presented by Mike Morley due to the absence of Bart Nyberg, Committee Chairman. Nominees for the three directors are Art Smitter, Bob Kersch and Jeff Looney. The directors serve three-year terms. Nominees for President, Vice President and Treasurer are Larry Rice, Bob Sipes and Chris DeHaan, respectively. These officers serve two-year terms.

Mike Morley will continue as Web site manager. He reported that a spam filter was added to the Web site for a nominal cost. Additional topics discussed included reinstating the member's blog, adding a guestbook and initiating a Yahoo group for facilitating book exchanges between members. It was decided that we will continue to allow public participation on society projects online. Making the membership roster accessible online was discussed and approved with the final format to be determined by the Web site manager. The roster will be restricted to the Archive section (which requires a password) on a trial basis with appropriate security features in place.

The regular *Strive & Succeed Award* fund balance totaled \$1,064.19. In addition to this amount, an extra \$1,000 was donated by two members to be earmarked specifically for this year's candidate. The board voted to award \$2,000 to the recipient, Alex Codeglia.

Jeff and Judy Looney offered to host the 2009 convention in Charlottesville, Virginia. The confirmed convention dates will be April 30 through May 3, 2009. The board voted to present this offer to the members at the business meeting lacking any other viable venues.

An honorarium of \$50 each to the Executive Director and **Newsboy** Editor was approved.

President Morley adjourned the meeting at 6:06 p.m.

Saturday, May 17

Members and guests had their choice of the Plaza Hotel's free continental breakfast or a gull breakfast at a nearby restaurant. The place of choice was the Casson Station.

In lieu of the formal book sale, the remainder of the morning and early afternoon was taken up by the completion of the donation and consignment auction. A complete summary of the auction is available on Pages 10-14.

The two-year proceeds from the Carl T. Hartmann Legacy Collection totaled \$6,699.50 (all proceeds to the Society) an H.A.S. record for a donation of books and memorabilia from a single source. The Horatio Alger Society is extremely grateful to Stanley Hartmann and his family for their generosity. Those of us who knew Carl personally are lucky to have had him as our Partic'lar Friend.

Following lunch on our own, attendees scattered throughout the Carson City, Virginia City and Lake Tahoe areas to visit scenic and historic sites. Those wishing to remain near the hotel took part in the arranged guided tour of the Nevada State Capitol building. Also available for visitors was the nearby Nevada State Museum, housed in the original U.S. Mint building. In its years of operation between 1870-95, the mint produced more than \$49 million in U.S. coinage. One of our special convention souvenirs (courtesy of the Morleys) was a commemorative coin struck from the old mint's restored Coin Press No. 1.

Another popular nearby attraction for members and guests was the Nevada State Railroad Museum, which included steam train rides for a nominal fare, along with several buildings housing exhibits of historic locomotives and rail cars.

Saturday evening is traditionally devoted to the annual linen-tablecloth H.A.S. banquet, which was held this year in the Rosewood Room. The meal was terrific, and presentation of the annual awards were worth the wait.

The Newsboy Award went to W.W. Norton, Inc., publisher of the recently released annotated edition of *Ragged Dick*. Carol Nackenoff accepted the plaque on behalf of the publisher. The Carl Hartmann Luck and Pluck Award was presented to Wendy and Bob Sipes,





Win with Ellis' Adrift on the Pacific as a follow-up in the November-December issue.

Now, we can show *In Search of Treasure* and *Work and Win* side by side, because earlier this summer, I found a copy of the Ellis book while on vacation. As you can see, the covers are identical, and as I mentioned in my brief piece accompanying Brad's "discovery" article last fall, these distinctive 1908-10 A.L. Burt issues are very hard to find because the publisher soon abandoned this attractive format for a less expensive binding. That's why *Wait and Win* and *In Search of Treasure* are two of the more difficult Alger first editions to locate.

Sad news from Ohio: Those of us who remember with fondness "Horatio in Ohio," hosted in Chillicothe in 1989 by Nell and Will Wright, got to meet many members of their family during one of our most successful and highly attended conventions. Will Wright (PF-639) died in 1992, just a few weeks after completing his term as H.A.S. President. Nell decided to remain with the Society in tribute to her husband, retaining his PF-639 number, and she remains a loyal member. Nell recently sent us a note concerning the death last December of son-in-law Don G. "Deacon" Kear, of Chillicothe. He had founded Kear Realty in 1950 and was the firm's head broker until his death. Nell mentioned that her daughter, Jan Wright Kear, continues to run the business.

A personal note: How many of us can say we worked for a Medal of Honor winner? Not many, I'd guess. If you're talking about World War II Medal of Honor recipients, there are precious few remaining. In Ken Burns' recent documentary film "The War," we are told American World War II veterans are dying at a rate of more than a thousand a day.

So it was little surprise that I recently learned of the death on March 5 at his retirement home in Washington State of Captain Richard M. McCool, USN, my commanding officer at the Navy's Fleet Home Town News Center in 1970-71. He was 85.


When Captain McCool arrived at Great Lakes as my boss (I was a Naval Reserve lieutenant at the time), we all knew he was a Medal of Honor recipient, but were advised not to bring up the subject because his innate modesty made him very reluctant to discuss what had happened 25 years before.

Eventually, I went to a book on all the American Medal of Honor recipients and found out what the 1944 Naval Academy graduate did to earn the nation's highest honor, which was awarded by President Harry S Truman. McCool, then a lieutenant, was in command of an LCS (L) — "light landing craft, support" — on radar

picket duty off Okinawa in June 1945. What "radar pickets" did was use their radar rangefinders to warn the American fleet of incoming kamikaze aircraft, which were hitting our aircraft carriers and other large ships covering the Okinawa amphibious landings.

Most radar-picket work was done by destroyers, but the kamikaze threat became so acute that other, smaller craft (an LCS was manned by a crew of fewer than ten) were pressed into action. McCool was in charge of such a small landing craft, not as fast or maneuverable as a destroyer. It was a speck on the ocean compared to the major fleet units. So why a kamikaze pilot would choose to plunge his plane that day into the tiny LCS (L) 122 instead of an aircraft carrier remains a mystery.

McCool's Medal of Honor citation reads, in part: "Although suffering from shrapnel wounds and pain-

ful burns, he rallied his concussion-shocked crew and initiated vigorous firefighting measures and then proceeded to the rescue of several trapped in a blazing compartment, subsequently carrying one man to safety despite the excruciating pain of several severe burns.

"Unmindful of all personal danger, he continued his efforts without respite until aid arrived from other ships and he was evacuated. By his staunch leadership, capable direction, and

indomitable determination throughout the crisis, Lieutenant McCool saved the lives of many who otherwise would have perished."

Following the war, the Oklahoma native received his Master's degree in public relations from Boston University and served in several public information positions within the Navy until his 1974 retirement.

What impressed me most about his Medal of Honor actions were the fact they were sustained over a lengthy period and involved both the saving of his ship and fellow crewmembers. He had a chance to jump overboard and save himself first, but he did not. He stuck it out, risking his life in the process.

In addition to inside knowledge of public relations and the media, which he shared with me the two years we worked together, Captain McCool offered one bit of anecdotal wisdom that I still remember.

In casual conversation, I referred to a Navy ship as a "vessel." "Never use the word 'vessel' when describing a ship," he admonished. "A vessel is a chamber pot, and you know what that's used for. Call a ship a ship. That's the correct term."

May you rest in peace, Captain McCool.

Augusta's magazine publishing giant — a true Horatio Alger story

Introduction

Of the dozens of publishers involved with producing Alger first editions and reprints, none is more obscure then Vickery & Hill, located in Maine's state capital of Augusta. The major reason, of course, is that only one Alger title, *The Five Hundred Dollar Check*, appeared in a Vickery & Hill edition (ca. 1908-10) as an inexpensive reprint. Other reprint publishers of this and its variant titles (\$500, Five Hundred Dollars) included Hurst, New York Book, M.A. Donohue, Federal and David McKay. Street & Smith published it in hard cover as well as in its **Brave and Bold Weekly** (abridged) and as **Alger Series** paperback No. 6.

The following article offers an interesting insight into the only Maine firm to publish a hard-cover Alger book. The article first appeared in the magazine **Discover Maine** in 2006.

Please note that a couple facts about Alger in the article are inaccurate, and the author's statement that Alger's works are regarded today "...as poorly written and unimaginative because of their repetitive nature" is strictly his own opinion.




For more than 40 years, Horatio Alger, Jr., was one of the most popular writers in America. His name is synonymous with the rags-to-riches adventurers who helped create the myth of the American Dream. Today, many have the misconception that Horatio Alger was the fictional hero of a series of books rather than the series' author!

Beginning in 1865, Horatio Alger wrote some 30 dime novels describing the lives of poor and poverty-stricken young boys, and how they rose to positions of wealth and respect through hard work, moral fortitude and plain old persistence. All of Alger's successful fictional character creations were bonded by a common concern for their fellow man. Also, most of them seemed to find a mentor who helped them on their rise to success. Today, Alger's works are regarded as poorly written and unimaginative because of their repetitive nature. At the time they were written, however, they were wildly successful, appealing as they did to young men bent on securing their piece of the American Pie.

Horatio Alger, Jr., had a distinct tie to Maine's capital city, Augusta. The Augusta publishing house of Vickery & Hill, which reprinted one of Alger's most popular titles, was one of the companies that made a good deal of money from America's first great writer of books that

were aimed directly at the adolescent male. In fact, it could be said that Vickery & Hill was something of a Horatio Alger story itself.

In the years following the Civil War, Augusta companies rose to prominence in the publishing world as producers of mail-order magazines. From 1900 up until just before World War II, some four million magazines were mailed monthly from Augusta to subscribers all

over the country and abroad. The magazines bore titles such as Needlecraft, Comfort and Fireside Visitor. Both Needlecraft and Fireside Visitor were the best-knownVickery & Hill titles, and Comfort was published by W.H. Gannett, Inc.

Editor's note: Comfort published Alger's "Adrift in New York" in the May and June 1902 issues, as well as a two-part supple-

ment at the same time. (See article by William Russell (PF-549) in the September-October 1992 Newsboy).

Vickery & Hill was the only Augusta magazine publisher that went into book publishing in a big way. The men who owned Vickery & Hill were P. O. Vickery and John F. Hill. These two fine sons of Augusta rose to wealth and prominence the way Horatio Alger's characters did.

Today, John Hill's name is largely forgotten in Augusta, and Maine in general. Around the turn of the 20th century, it was very well known, as Hill was elected governor in 1900. Vickery's name has been preserved in the name of the Augusta office building known simply as The Vickery.

P.O. Vickery began life as a boy on a farm on the outskirts of Auburn before moving to Augusta. Hill's family was much more well-to-do, and he hailed from York County.

Vickery and Hill first rose to prominence in Augusta in the printing trade, and Vickery & Hill was formed as a company in 1882. Vickery's great success was Fireside Visitor, and Hill's was Needlecraft Magazine. Both magazines were targeted at women living in rural

America. In the late 1920s, Needlecraft had a circulation of one million copies, and that of Fireside Visitor was in the hundreds of thousands. Other publications the pair produced were Good Stories, Hearth and Home and Modern Homemaking. Together, the circulation of the latter magazines approached two million copies a month. The Horatio Alger books were published in addition to the successful magazine lines.

It can be said that P. O. Vickery was a true self-made man. Essentially self-educated, he felt financially secure enough to enter local politics in the mid-1870s, winning election to the Augusta City Council and Board of

Aldermen. He went on to serve as mayor of Augusta and as a member of the Mainer Legislature in the late 1870s and early 1880s.

John Hill was a doctor. He came to Augusta in the late 1870s after graduating from Long Island College. Within a short time he found himself drawn into the political arena and to Augusta's burgeoning publishing

industry. Without a doubt, the fact that he married Lida Vickery, P. O. Vickery's only daughter, had something to do with the latter.

Vickery died in 1902, and John Hill continued in control of Vickery & Hill until his own death in 1912. Laura Hill then succeeded her father as company president, with her brother, Percy Hill, acting as treasurer. In the late 1920s, the company employed some 300 workers, and the force was almost equally divided among men and women. The company had a payroll of about \$400,000 annually; men earned about \$1.65 a day, but women only \$1.00.

Publishing remained the chief industry of Augusta until the early 1940s. By that time, the American public had developed a more sophisticated reading taste, and the simple, down-to-earth style of Vickery & Hill's publications, as well as those of the city's other publishers, had passed their heyday. There was a time, however, when magazines like Fireside Visitor and Needlecraft helped further the cause of P. O. Vickery and John F. Hill, just like in Horatio Alger's characters' dreams.
